At a Court held for Mecklenburg County the 16th day of May 1825

This amount Current of Edmund Taylor administrator of Rebecca Taylor Decd was returned to Court by Commissioners appointed to settle the same- And at a Court held for our Said County on the 18th day of July 1825. The Same having been returned two months and no exceptions taken thereto, was confirmed, and ordered to be recorded-

Transcription notes: Used decimal point instead of the ledger line in the account book. I believe the Dr means “draft”, legal term Barron’s Dictionary of Legal Terms 5th Edition c. 2016 says: 1. draft: an order in writing directing a person other than the **maker** to pay a specified sum to a named person. Sight draft: one that is payable on demand; a bill of exchange for immediate collection.
