and Gum thence North twenty five degrees West seven hundred and eleven  
poles to two Hickories small Elm and Oak on a Ridge Thence South  
fifty Eight degrees West seven hundred and seventy seven poles to a  
Water Poplar on the Bank of the river thence down the Meanders and  
bending thereon South twenty six degrees East three hundred and Eight  
Poles thence South thirty degrees East three hundred and twenty four poles  
to the Beginning with its appurtenances to have and to hold the said  
Tract or Parcel of Land with its appurtenances to the said Thomas  
Boylston &c and their heirs forever In witness whereof the said James  
Garrard Esq: Governor of the Commonwealth of Kentucky hath hereunto  
set his hand and caused the Seal of the said Commonwealth to be affixed at  
Frankfort on the Twenty Eighth day of June in the year of Our Lord one thousand  
seven hundred and seventy nine and of the Commonwealth the Eighth
