running thence north twenty one degrees East four hundred and thirty four
paces to two Black Oaks and Hickory crossing a Branch at two hundred

and five degrees and at two hundred and thirty six paces thence
North twenty degrees East Eighty paces to a Hickory black Oak and white

Oak in the head of a Hollow thence south twenty degrees East
four hundred and twenty paces to a sweet gum and two poplars crossing
a branch

abouich of lost Creek several times at 110 poles thence south twenty
 one degrees West two hundred and fifty two poles to a White Oak
 Black Oak and Hickory thence north Twenty degrees West one
 hundred and fifty six poles to Black Oak Hickory and large Dogwood
 on the Point of a Hill thence south twenty four degrees West three
 hundred and twelve poles to Black Oak Poplar and Hickory thence
 north fifty seven degrees West two hundred and forty five poles to the
 Beginning with its appurtenances to have and to hold the said tract
 appurtenances of Lime with its appurtenances to the said Francis Poythress
 He and his heirs forever In witness whereof the said James Garrard
 Esquire Governour of the Commonwealth of Kentucky hath hereunto set
 his hand and caused the Seal of the said Commonwealth to be
 affixed at Frankfort on the Twenty Eighth day of June in the
 Year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and ninety seven
 and of the Commonwealth the Eighth
